# "Regulation for Examination (Semester System) At Post Graduate Level, Under Autonomous Scheme"

Bilaspur Universtiy, Bilaspur (C.G.) vide letter No. 277/Bub/Acad/2012dated 12/9/2012 has granted affiliation to the Govt. Girls' P.G. College, Bilaspur (C.G.) Further the University Grants Commission, New Delhi vide letter No. F-22.01.2005 (Desk-AC) December 2005 and Guru Ghasidas University, Bilaspur (C.G.) vide letter No. 81/CDC/Auto/2006 dated 22.05.2006 have extended the autonomous Govt. Girls' P.G. College upto 2011 which has been again extended till the session 2016-17 vide letter No. UGC F-22-1/2011 AC January 2012. The University has authorized Govt. Girls' P.G. College, Bilaspur (C.G.) to frame syllabus and conduct examination in the following faculties the subjects at the Post Graduate level.

As per the decision taken by the Co-ordination Committee in its Eleventh meeting, and in compliance of the order issued by the Directorate of Higher Education, vide letter No. 341/187/CHE/Co-ord/06 dated 27.04.2006 Govt. Girls' P.G. College Bilaspur (C.G.) is semester system of examination from the session 2007 at post Graduate Level.

- 2. The course, of siudy at the post Graduate Level (Master of Science, Master of Arts and Master of Commerce) is extended over four semesters in two academic Sessions. Examination of the first & Second semesters will be held in the first academic session and the third and fourth semesters in the second academic session.
- 3. Practical Examination of the science Faculty / Subjects will be held with the theory examination in each semester, where as Viva-Voce Examination of Arts and Commerce Faculty will be held with the theory examination of second and fourth semester.

#### ADMISSION:

- 4. The admission in the Post Graduate Classes shall be strictly on merit basis in accordance to the admission rules of Govt. of Chhattisgarh State.
- 5. A graduate from any recognized University of Chhattisgarh State is eligible for admission in the Post Graduate Classes. A graduate from any recognized University outside of the Chhattisgarh state will also be eligible for admission in the Post Graduate Classes provided, she fulfills all other conditions of eligibility.

#### **SYLLABUS:**

- 6. Each course shall be framed and approved by the Board of studies of that subject and Academic Council of the college.
- 7. There shall be four or five theory papers in each subjects in each semester Practical examination of the subjects shall be conducted as per the syllabus framed and approved by the Board of Studies of that subject.
- 8. A student who has 60% or more aggregate marks in three semester can opt Dissertation as an Optional Paper in the forth semester if there is such a provision in the course of that subject.
- 9. In the theory papers of semester examination, there shall be 80 marks for external examination and 20 marks for internal examination. Each theory paper of the semester examination shall be of 80 marks in which there shall be ten questions in total out of which a candidate will have to attempt five questions Maximum marks of the practical decided by the board of studies of the subject.

#### **EXAMINATION PATTERN:**

- 10. There shall be main examination at the end of the each semester First and Third semester examination shall be held as for a possible in the month of November and second & fourth semester examination shall be held as for as possible in the month of April.
- 11. To be successful in the exam a student has to score at least 20% marks in each Internal & External theory papers with an aggregate of 36% marks. Also to be successful in each practical paper a student has to score 36 marks. Best marks of the two internal text examination will be incorporated in the marks of semester examination. The head of the department shall submit the detailed mark list to the controller of Examination after the completion of all tests and seminars.
- 12. A student declared fail in one paper in the semester examination can appear in the second attempt examination in the same paper which will be held after two months of the main semester examination but if a student declared failed in more than two papers of semester examination will be not eligible to appear second attempt examination.
- 13. If a student is absent in all the papers of the main semester examination then she will be ineligible to appear in the second attempt examination, but if a student appears in some papers and fail to appear in the remaining papers of the main semester examination then she will have to submit an application giving reason to . the principal / Controller with sufficient proofs. On the basis of proofs a High level committee will decide upon the matter. High level committee will have power to allow the student to appear in the second attempt examination.
- 14. A student who fails in a semester examination shall be eligible to take admission in the course of study of next semester but she shall not be eligible to appear in the next semester examination unless has passed all the remaining papers of the previous semester in the second attempt examination.
- 15. The admission of the student who fails in the second attempt examination of a semester, the admission to the next semester will automatically be cancelled and she will have to appear in all the papers of the semester examination in the next academic session as an Ex-student but marks of the internal examination will carry forward.

- 16 .It is a must for the students to appear in the Internal test on the scheduled dates which will be declared by examination cell failing to which she shall be declared fail. If due to some unavoidable circumstances and sufficient reason the students fails to appear in the test on scheduled dates they have to appear before the High level Committee comprising of the Principal, Controller of Exam and Head of the Department of the particular subject with sufficient proof. The high level committee will decide the matter based on the proofs submitted by the students.
- 17 If a student leaves the college after taking admission in a course of study of semester without appearing in Internal & External examination and if she would like to take admission in any forthcoming academic session in the same semester she shall be given admission in the same session as a regular student but her status will be of Ex-student,
- 18. For Diploma courses there shall be annual examination pattern in which only external examination and practical examination will be held. There shall be no internal examination and seminars for these courses. Syllabus of these courses shall be framed by the board of studies, of the particular subject.
- 19. For B.Lib. I.Sc. course there shall be Annual Examination pattern and Internal tests & seminars will be organized.

#### DIVISION AWARD

- 20. The division shall be awarded at the end of the Fourth Semester on the basis of taking together the aggregate of marks obtained by the students in all the four semester examination. The division shall be awarded on the following basis
  - 1- I Division 60% & above
  - 2- II Division 48% & above but less than 60%
  - 3- III Division 36% & above but less than 48%
- 21. A candidate who fails by one mark in a paer or in aggregate, shall be given grace mark but this one mark shall no where be added. Such candidate shall be declared pass with grace.
- 22. A candidate who lacks one mark to attain division shall be given one grace marks.
- 23. The names of first five candidates who have obtained first division at the end of the forth Semester will be declared in the order of merit.

### **REVALUATION:-**

- 24. A candidate can apply for revaluation of answer books in one theory papers: She has to pay prescribed fee for each paper within 15 days after the publication of the result of the semester examination. The provision of revaluation is only for the main exam and there is no provision of revaluation for the second attempt examination.
- 25. The change in the marks will depend upon the rules of revaluation issued by the Bilaspur University, Bilaspur from time to time.
- 26. The points, which are not covered in the regulation mentioned above shall be governed by the existing rules, regulation and ordinance of Bilaspur University, Bilaspur (C.G.)

At the Graduate Level of Commerce subject courses related to the computer has been kept as compulsory subject in B.Com. (Plain).

- (i) These subjects are compulsory for all students:-
  - (a) Environmental Studies (I Semester)
  - (b) General English (II and III Semester)
  - (c) General Hindi (IV and V Semester)
  - (d) Skill Based Course (VI Semester)
- (ii) In each semester there will be only one theory paper in each elective group.
- (iii) For Honours Degree Course, There will be one additional theory paper in each semester i.e. semesters III and IV.
- (iv) For Honours Degree Course, separate practical classes will be held round the year but the examinations shall be held only in even semesters i.e. semesters II, IV and VI.

#### 4. Marks Pattern :-

(i) For non practical subjects each theory paper will be of 100 marks i.e. 80 External + 20 Internal.

- (ii) For practical subjects each theory paper will be of 75 marks i.e. 60 External + 15 Internal.
- (iii) Practical examination will be of 50 marks. Practical Classes will be held round the year but examination shall be held only in even semesters i.e. semesters II, IV and VI.

## 5. Theory Examination:-

Duration for theory examination shall be of two and half hours.

#### 6. Practical Examination:

Duration for Practical examination shall be as suggested in the syllabi.

#### 7. Admission Period:-

- (i) Admissions in the First Semester shall be completed before 15 July every year.
- (ii) Admissions in other Semesters i.e. II, III, IV, V and VI shall be completed within 7 days after the completion of examinations and provisional basis.
- (iii) The provisional admission shall be regularized within 7 days from the date of declaration of result.
- (iv) Request for permission for late admission shall not be entertained.

#### 8. Schedule of Classes-

- (i) I Semester's classes will be commenced from 16<sup>th</sup> July every year
- (ii) III and V Semester's classes will be commenced from 2<sup>nd</sup> July every year.
- (iii) II, IV and VI Semester's classes will be commenced from 2<sup>nd</sup> January every year.
- (iv) All the classes shall be continued till seven days before the commencement of the examination.
- 9. Examination Schedule- Tentative Schedules of examinations are as under-
- (i) Odd semester 20<sup>th</sup> November to 20<sup>th</sup> December.
- (ii) Even semester- 15th April to 14th May.

#### Examination Pattern -

- (a) Questions will be asked Unit wise and Section wise. Questions will be set from all Units covering the entire syllabi.
- (b) For non practical subjects, maximum marks will be 80 (External).
- (c) For the practical based subjects, maximum marks will be 60 (External).
- (d) In each theory paper their will be three sections and the marks distributed for different sections will be in the following manner-

# Theory (Non- Practical) :- There will be three sections A, B and C in the question paper.

## Section - A Objective Type/ In few words (30 words)

There will be 15 questions to be set, three from each unit and 10 to be attempted. Each question carries 2 marks.

## **Section - B Short Answer Type (60 words)**

There will be 5 questions to be set, 1 from each unit and all five questions to be attempted. Each question carries 6 marks.

## Section - C Long Answer / Eassy Type Question

There will be 5 questions to be set, 1 from each unit and 2 to be attempted. Each question carries 15 marks.

# Section - B Short Answer Type (60 words)

There will be 5 questions to be set, 1 from each unit and all five questions to be attempted. Each question carries 4 marks.

# Section - C Long Answer / Eassy Type Question

There will be 5 questions to be set, 1 from each unit and 2 to be attempted. Each question carries 10 marks.

- (e) In odd semester examination, a candidate shall appear in papers of odd semester(s) only. Similarly in even semester examinations, a candidate shall appear in papers of even semester(s) only. Papers of odd and even semesters shall not be confined in one examination.
- (f) Minimum passing marks for external/ semester end theory and practical shall be 34%.
- (g) There shall be provision of 3 grace marks and it would be distributed in maximum two theory paper.

#### **Internal Assessment**

Internal Tests are compulsory for theory papers and must be held as per following calendar:-

Odd Semester  $1^{st}$  Test- August ,  $2^{nd}$  Test October and 01 Assignment (during semester) Even Semester  $1^{st}$  Test February ,  $2^{nd}$  Test March and 01 Assignment (during semester)

Each test & Assignment will be of 20 marks for the subjects without practical & 15 marks for the subjects having practicals. Average of the marks obtained in the best two tests & assignment shall be incorporated as the final mark. Qualifying marks is 40%.

If a candidate failed to attend the test on bonafide grounds, one special test may be arranged on the production of relevant documents, before submission of application forms and fees to the office.

The Unit tests/Assignment marks to be sent to the examination cell of the college as per notification to be issued by the Principal/ Controller Examination from time to time.

If a candidated (whose status is Regular / Ex/Supplementary) failed in First Year of the current session (2013-14) of annual system will be appeared in the first semester examination as ex-student with under the rules and regulations of Semester System. Number of Internal Test of passed year (2013-14) will not be incorporated or carried forward.

## Eligibility criteria for appearing in the examinations

- (i) A candidate should have 75% of attendance both in theory and practical classes. 65% attendance may be considered only on special circumstances and on certification by the Principal of the college.
- (ii) A candidate shall have to qualify in the internal tests securing at least 40% marks.
- (iii) A candidate shall be allowed to appear in those papers only in which she has secured qualifying marks in internal test.
- (iv) If a candidate after taking admission in 1<sup>st</sup> semester could not continue the classes or could not obtain eligibility cannot appear in the 1<sup>st</sup> semester examinations. In such cases the student will not be allowed to continue in second semester and <u>she has to continue the classes and obtain eligibility in 1<sup>st</sup> semester again in next academic year as ex-student.</u>

#### **Lecture Periods / Classes**

There shall be a minimum of 50-60 hours Classes for each theory papers in respective course. Minimum of 50-60 hours shall be for each practical paper. This shall be strictly adhered to

#### **Promotion Rules**

- (a) A candidate is eligible to continue the second semester classes immediately after the 1<sup>st</sup> semester examinations and can appear in the 2<sup>nd</sup> semester examinations notwithstanding the number of arrear papers in 1<sup>st</sup> semester provided she must have appeared in the 1<sup>st</sup> semester examinations.
- (b) A candidate will be promoted to  $3^{rd}$  semester with not more than two back papers of  $1^{st}$  semester and she will continue to attend classes of  $3^{rd}$  semester provisionally.

She will be allowed to get final admission in the  $3^{rd}$  semester with maximum of four back papers in all in  $1^{st}$  semester and  $2^{nd}$  semester.

- (c) A candidate will be promoted to 4<sup>th</sup> semester with not more than two back papers of 2<sup>nd</sup> semester and she will continue to attend classes of 4<sup>th</sup> semester provisionally. She will be allowed to get final admission in the 4<sup>th</sup> semester with maximum of four back papers in all in 2<sup>nd</sup> semester and 3<sup>rd</sup> semester.
- (d) A candidate will be promoted to 5<sup>th</sup> semester with not more than two back papers of 3<sup>rd</sup> semester and she will continue to attend classes of 5<sup>th</sup> semester provisionally. She will be allowed to get final admission in the5<sup>th</sup> semester with any number of back papers of 4<sup>th</sup> semester and only two back papers of 3<sup>rd</sup> semester.
- (e) A candidate will be promoted to  $6^{th}$  semester with not more than two back papers of 4th semester. She will be allowed to take admission finally in the  $6^{th}$  semester with any number of back papers of  $5^{th}$  semester and only two back papers of  $4^{th}$  semester.

#### Other Guidelines:-

- (i)There will be no provision for Revaluation, Supplementry or Betterment ( Division Improvement).
- (ii) A candidate has to clear all the papers within 12 semester (six years) from the year of first admission in the programme.
- (iii) A candidate will choose Honours subject just before the start of third semester from any one of the three elective subjects /group selected by her in the first semester. A candidate can change the Honours subject within 15 days from the date of admission in the third semester.
- (iv) The system of credit of ten point scale examination marks in the final mark sheet shall be introduced only after its formal approval by the competent authorities.
- (v) The system of Choice based credit system and Gradation system shall be introduced only after its formal approval by the competent authorities.

For Honours Degree Course (Total Marks: 2800).

**Admission -** The process of admission in Honours Degree Course is as follows -

- (i) Student's shall select courses (Pass Course / Honours Degree Course) at the time of first admission in the college.
- (ii) Admission shall be on merit basis after receiving the application from students.
- (iii) Number of seats for Honour Degree Course will be decided as per the Govt. Rules.
